

Announced COVID-19 Federal Economic Stimulus Measures for Businesses and Workers (as of March 31, 2020)

Wage subsidies for small business	An up to 75 per cent wage subsidy for qualifying businesses, for up to 3 months, retroactive to March 15, 2020.	<p>75% of first \$58,700 salary earned (Max \$847/wk)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Firms that have suffered 30%+ revenue loss as a result of COVID-19 Firms of all size eligible; also non-profits etc. Firms are encouraged to pay the 25% top-up to employees if they can afford it. Deferral of Sales Tax Remittance and Customs Duty Payments (CRA/CBSA)	Businesses, including self-employed individuals, can defer until June 30, 2020 payments of the Goods and Services Tax / Harmonized Sales Tax (GST/HST), as well as customs duties owing on their imports.	<p>Deferral applies to GST/HST remittances for the February, March and April 2020 reporting periods for monthly filers; the January 1, 2020 through March 31, 2020 reporting period for quarterly filers; and for annual filers, the amounts collected and owing for their previous fiscal year and instalments of GST/HST in respect of the filer's current fiscal year. Businesses in need of information about their particular obligations may contact the Canada Revenue Agency or refer to its website.</p> <p>For GST and customs duty payments for imported goods, deferral will include amounts owing for March, April and May. Business Credit Availability Program (BCAP) - <i>Canada Emergency Business Account</i>	Provides interest-free loans of up to \$40,000 to small businesses and not-for-profits, to help cover their operating costs. Repaying the balance of the loan on or before December 31, 2022 will result in loan forgiveness of 25 percent (up to \$10,000).	Organizations will need to demonstrate they paid between \$50,000 to \$1 million in total payroll in 2019. Eligible businesses may obtain incremental credit amounts of up to \$6.25 million through the program. Farm Credit Canada (FCC) lending	FCC has received an enhancement to its capital base that will allow for an additional \$5 billion in lending capacity. Improved access to Employment Insurance sickness benefits	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Waive the requirement to provide a medical certificate to access EI sickness benefits if sick, quarantined or directed to self-isolate.
